General Advance Care Planning

The General ACP Facilitators' Course trains participants to facilitate the documentation of Advance Care Plans (ACPs) for generally healthy adults. Participants are taught interviewing skills to explore an individual's stage of health, past experiences and values surrounding life, illness and dying. Based on this exploration, facilitators will then help individuals to articulate their future care preferences into an ACP. This plan provides guidance to the medical team when the individual loses mental capacity. The conversation also allows individuals to appoint a Nominated Healthcare Spokesperson (NHS), and clarify relevant health matters. Participants will also learn about other advance directives.

Physicians must pass the final assessment to be certified as General ACP Facilitators.

Learning Objectives

By the end of the programme, participants would be able to:

- Facilitate the appointment of a suitable Nominated Healthcare Spokesperson (NHS) for healthy adults
- Explore an individual's stage of health, past experiences and their values surrounding life, illness and dying
- Assist individuals to establish their care preferences
- Document an official Advance Care Plan (ACP) for national records
